

school here in the State of Nebraska. Now is there some rationale, I am sure that there is, that the child would be examined and immunized at the beginning grade as well as again in the seventh grade when they begin junior high school?

SENATOR KOCH: Yes, because, Senator Stoney, that normally we examine a number of students at the beginning of seventh grade and you know why they do. Having a son that has been in athletics, you know that that was always the requirement that they demonstrate a physical examination of a physician prior to the time that they are admitted into the activity. There again the Crippled Children's Commission and others who are concerned about the health of young people have requested that we ask that this be repeated again prior to the time of entering the seventh grade because there again you have another opportunity to detect certain kinds of physical problems that may not have been detected at the first type of physical examination.

SENATOR STONEY: Are all seventh graders examined then, Senator Koch, or just those who would participate in certain athletic programs?

SENATOR KOCH: No, this would be each child one more time, Senator Stoney, at entering seventh grade. They would have to demonstrate again a physical for entry into that grade.

SENATOR STONEY: But presently, the examination that is given in the seventh grade to all seventh grade students or just those who wish to participate?

SENATOR KOCH: Just those who want to participate in certain kinds of athletics.

SENATOR STONEY: All right, the next question with reference to transfers from out state, what if that student has been examined in that state, is there any reciprocal agreement so the individual would not be subjected to yet another examination, another immunization which would be at the cost of the parents?

SENATOR KOCH: I am certain, Senator Stoney, that if that student had a recent examination and a letter from that physician from whatever state it was would be adequate to meet the intent of the bill.

SENATOR STONEY: Last question, Senator Koch, on the second page of the amendments dealing with the immunization and
