this particular provision and then we have the loose wording as to whether funds may or may not be available in case of a parent's ability to afford this type of immunization and Senator Koch guaranteed and assured me that on Select File he would have an amendment to strengthen that particular section. When that section is strengthened, I think we will have a very workable bill.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Chambers, did you want to close please?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, Mr. Chairman, I am nibbling away at this bill and I don't want to take two things in one bite which ought to be taken individually and what I am concerned about is the mandating of a birth certificate. Now Senator Koch and I have worked something out, and since it is my amendment, I believe I could do it without taking a vote. I would want my amendment to read as it does where you reinstate the "may", strike the "shall". That would mean that a birth certificate may be required but something in lieu of that could be required. Then on the following line 3, after the word "and", put the two words "shall require". Then Senator Koch has what he is concerned about, the requirement of the evidence as to the physical. That is a separate issue. My amendment now will only deal with the mandating of a birth certificate. That no longer will be a mandate. It may be accepted but something in lieu of it can be as has been the case in a lot of instances. So with that, Senator Koch, okay, you can tell them.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Chairman.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: I accept that as a friendly amendment and that is reasonable and I would move to adopt the Chambers amendment as he has stated it to the Clerk, may require a birth certificate or they could require a baptismal record but they shall require the physical. That is on line three.

SENATOR NICHOL: Okay. We are now voting on the Chambers amendment. All those voting for it vote green, those opposed vote red. Mr. Clerk, record please.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.
