SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is on the Fowler amendment to the DeCamp amendment (3). All those in favor vote aye. Opposed vote no. It takes a majority of those voting. Have you all voted? The motion is on the Fowler amendment to the DeCamp amendment number (3). Have you all voted? Senator DeCamp, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Just to get ready for the next shot. So much for that power theory, huh?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Have you all voted? Okay, I'm going to... Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 12 nays, 6 excused and not voting, 6 present and not voting, Mr. President. (Record vote may be found on Page 776 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the Fowler amendment is adopted. Now we're ready for the DeCamp amendment number (3) as amended. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes, Mr. President. Looking at the vote I suppose I better move the adoption of the amendment and sit down.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is that what you're going to do? Okay. The motion is on the adoption of the DeCamp amendment number (3) as amended by the Fowler amendment. All those in favor vote aye. Opposed vote no. Clerk record the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the amended amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the amendment's adopted. Before we start the next amendment, in the north balcony, it's my pleasure to introduce fifty 4th Grade students from Mt. Claire School in Omaha, with teachers Mary Nelson and Nancy Burns, and they're in Senator Stoney's District. Will you raise your hands so we may say hello to you?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Well, Mr. President, maybe we can pick up the
