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back like Amoco, \$489, and I saw that the bank account was pretty well depleted and then I got a letter one day that said you have not made your payment on your \$2,800 whatever it was, car or something, and I called the kid in and I said, what is going on? He said, I am just doing your work. I said, how could you spend \$400 on gas. He said, well, I had to entertain some people and I thought it would be nice if I did this for them. And I says, well, you had a checking account too and he said, well, I had to use that too and then he told me about a car he had bought because he thought he needed that. Well the point I am making is, I wonder if maybe in all our good desire on the NRDs and soil conservation, water, all sacred words, you know. We just throw them out there and, by golly, if you say anything bad, why you are against water conservation or against soil conservation, you are against one of these things. But I wonder while we are doing this we haven't let things get out of control. Maybe we gave the kid too much of a blank check. Now we have got this fund and that fund and this fund and then we have got property tax financing which we increased. Heck, who knows how much we increased it this year. We tripled it or whatever in the one fund which is separate from the other fund, we might remember, we tripled it in that one and then we are going to have equalization which is going to increase, I think maybe we had better get a handle on where we are going. Now I just learned something else from Senator Schmit here in the last thirty minutes and I hope he is mistaken and I have to believe he is so, Senator Schmit, I'd ask you a question. You said, you said that the NRDs or somebody had obligated somebody for another six million bucks, now how can they do that? How can somebody go out and obligate me and the other 48 people here for six million bucks that we haven't said we are going to give them yet or anything else, is that what you were saying?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, do I have the right to answer?

PRESIDENT: Yes, you may respond.

SENATOR SCHMIT: What I am saying, Senator DeCamp, is that according to the Natural Resources development fund status project applications only that we have requested twelve million, the NRDs have requested \$12,842,740. The amount allocated is \$12,617,000. They cut it back \$235,000.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes, but did they approve it?
