SENATOR LEWIS PRESIDING

SENATOR LEWIS: Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, realizing that Senator Kremer is working desperately hard on this bill, and the concept I think we do agree with, and the fine points that we are concerned with, I would ask unanimous consent then to withdraw my amendment at this particular time.

SENATOR LEWIS: You've heard Senator Carsten's request. He asked unanimous consent to withdraw the amendment. Is there any objection? If not, so ordered. Senator Maresh. Schmit, and we're speaking to the Schmit-Cullan amendment. Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Speak on the Kremer amendment now.

SENATOR LEWIS: Mr. Clerk, where are we?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Carsten has just withdrawn his amendment, and now I believe Senator Schmit and Senator Cullan wish to withdraw their pending amendments.

SENATOR LEWIS: Senator Schmit or Senator Cullan. Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I withdraw my amendment.

SENATOR LEWIS: Senator Schmit asks unanimous consent to withdraw the amendment. Do I see objection? If not, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President...Senator DeCamp, you don't want to offer yours.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I ask unanimous consent to withdraw.

SENATOR LEWIS: Senator DeCamp has asked unanimous consent to withdraw his amendments. Seeing no objections, so ordered.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, I have other amendments but those particular individuals have been excused, so I now
