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language in many things. What's the alternative? Wait till you get there and then it's too late. We do have models in operation today in some areas of the state that are telling us what's going to happen in the future based on certain input that's put into that model. And what it's reading today it says down the road in the foreseeable future we're going to have some problems. Senator Schmit, I said before to you, I envy you. I wish that I was in an area where I could say the groundwater level is coming up. Unfortunately I'm not, and there are many others like this. How to deal with this is going to be doggone tough. We're now trying to figure out some way that we bring about a recharge. We have an experiment going on in my own county...how can we recharge the underground water? Can we bring water in? Senator Schmit, I'd like for you...I told you before I'd like to have you divide that with me and you never will do it, so if you'd give me what you've too much, then we'd both get along real fine, but you won't do that, but maybe somebody else will some time. But...

SENATOR LEWIS: Senator DeCamp, I think that Senator Kremer has the floor. If you want to speak later on, we'll sure recognize you. Senator Kremer, you may continue.

SENATOR KREMER: I would again like to explain what the bill does, other than the sections that I now...I'll do that later, Mr. Chairman. I spoke to the amendments. I'm sorry I won't get to the bill. I will do that later on.

SENATOR LEWIS: Thank you.

SENATOR KREMER: I move the amendments that I laid on the Clerk's desk and they have been read to you.

SENATOR LEWIS: The question before you is the adoption of the Kremer amendment. Does anyone wish it read? Do you all understand it? The question is the adoption of the Kremer amendment. All those in favor will vote aye. Those opposed will vote no. Voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Lewis voting aye.

SENATOR LEWIS: Have you all voted? The issue before the House is the Kremer amendment. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR LEWIS: The amendment's adopted. Now to the bill itself. Do you have a problem?
