LB 508

SENATOR KREMER: In my previous remarks I said I have confidence, I do, that the bill will come out. I cannot guarantee it. Some amendments are being proposed and we will have an executive session sometime tomorrow...

SENATOR GEORGE: Did you have a vote on 507 all ready in committee?

SENATOR KREMER: No, sir.

SENATOR GEORGE: There has been no vote on 507? Is has still to advance or anything like it?

SENATOR KREMER: It is still in committee.

SENATOR GEORGE: It is just sitting in committee but you said you are going to have some kind of a committee action by tomorrow? Okay, thank you.

SENATOR KREMER: If we can get together, we hope to.

SENATOR GEORGE: Maybe Senator Schmit might agree to wait a day or two if you are not too impatient to see what the Public Works Committee is going to do with 507?

PRESIDENT: Was that a question of Senator Schmit?

SENATOR GEORGE: No, rather not. I would rather finish because Senator Schmit has a habit of giving rather long answers but it might be a suggestion to maybe wait another day and see what the Public Works Committee is going to do. I certainly would support Senator Schmit if the Public Works Committee doesn't see fit to turn LB 507 on the floor. We do need one of the two of them.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I rise to support Senator Kremer in his opposition to Senator Schmit's motion. First of all I agree with a point that Senator Schmit made and that was that the agricultural groups were conspicuous by their absences at either the hearing on LB 507 or 508 and I do want to commend Senator Schmit and Senator Kremer for bringing these issues before us, however, I do believe there are five votes at this point in time with the amendments to bring LB 507 to the floor. I think the committee has studied those amendments and for that reason I would prefer LB 507. I would be surprised, Senator Schmit, if 507 is not advanced and for that reason I see no
