SENATOR CULLAN: I don't know, Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Now I am just asking these questions, Senator Cullan, not to embarrass you, but to show you historically this Legislature has made certain kind of determinations to treat certain kinds of classes of schools in a different way. I agree with you. Transportation possibly we ought to study and I intend to as the chairman of that committee to see whether or not there are inequities and try to solve the problem and to codify all the law on transportation in one area so that we know where it is as Senators and as school people and others and I intend to do this before next session.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is on the returning of the bill for a specific amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the returning of LB 425 to Select File for a specific amendment. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? We are voting on the return of LB 425 for a specific amendment. I am going to call for the vote once more. Have you all voted? Senator Simon.

SENATOR SIMON: Well, Mr. President, it appears that just about everybody is here that is going to be here unless somebody wants to change. It's pretty inevitable what the final vote is going to be. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 7 nays on the motion to return.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is returned. Now...

SENATOR SIMON: Move for the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, would you explain the second amendment once more?

SENATOR SIMON: The second amendment clarifies some language. It allows people if they are going to use their own cars, that they should not be reimbursed for more than the actual cost. That is a clarifying language. I think we have all ready discussed the aspect in terms of the Class 3 only. I move for the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the amendment to LB 425. All those in favor vote... Excuse me, Senator Kahle.
