CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: So the motion now, Senator Warner, is to advance the bill to E & R for engrossment.

SENATOR WESELY: I so move.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of advancing the bill vote aye, opposed vote no. Okay, all those in favor of advancing the bill say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. The bill is advanced. The next bill is LB 65.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are E & R amendments to LB 65.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, I move the E & R amendments to LB 65.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 65. All those in favor say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. The E & R amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Carsten now moves to amend. Senator, you have two sets. Which do you prefer first? Does it make any difference?

SENATOR CARSTEN: It is a clarification amendment. The second one deals with mobile home. I want the other one first.

CLERK: The one that is in the Journal?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Yes.

CLERK: Senator Carsten has amendments, Mr. President, which may be found on page 884 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this amendment is one that was brought to me by the bill drafter, and in working with LB 65, he discovered this was obsolete language. It is a cleanup amendment is all that it is to get that obsolete material out of the statutes. I move for the adoption thereof.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Carsten amendment #1 to LB 65. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record.
