SENATOR MARSH: Hearing no objection, it is withdrawn.

CLERK: Senator DeCamp now has amendments pending but I understand he wishes to withdraw those as well.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator DeCamp. Hearing no objection, they are withdrawn.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Murphy now has amendments and those amendments are on page 976 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: Madam President, the occasion for this amendment is simply to help an old plumber understand the writing of the bill drafter because I got a little bit mixed up trying to read that as to whether we were talking about total cost, the Highway Department cost, the subdivision cost, just what balance of the fund we are talking about. So I have simply added the word "matching" in two places for the sake of making it a little more legible for we slow readers. I ask the adoption of the amendment. It changes nothing, simply clarifies what is presently expressed.

SENATOR MARSH: The amendment is at the top of page 976, beginning on 975. Senator Dworak, do you wish to speak on this amendment? Your light is on. Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: I want to talk on the whole bill when it gets fully amended.

SENATOR MARSH: The Murphy amendment is before us. All those in favor signify by voting aye. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Murphy's amendment.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Murphy's amendment is adopted.
