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as to what that amount would be. Adult funeral services is defined because certain references are made to package deals that would be based on what constitutes an adult funeral service.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Thirty seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The rest of them, I think, are self-explanatory. Now let me get to 39, the memorial society. That is something which does occur in Nebraska now. There is one in existence in Omaha, but since reference is made to it in the bill, it should be mentioned in the definition section. If you have objections to any of the definitions, I wish you would raise them, and if not, Mr. Chairman, my motion at this point is to adopt sections 1 through 39 which would make up the definitions that I have just briefly reviewed.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: I would certainly have no objections to adding those definitions, nor really to the process that Senator Chambers is putting before us. I served on the Appropriations Committee that is the first step in the rather cumbersome sunset process and I would have to admit that although as Mr. Higley indicated our staff looked at the FTC report, I did not. I think that it is unfortunate that that was not discussed at any great depth by this committee, the Appropriations Committee, nor by the Public Health Committee, but I think the sunset process is the best time to address these sorts of questions. I would disagree with Senator Cullan that we should wait until next year to try to deal with these sorts of issues. Now is the one time that we might have the attention of the funeral directors. Next year there will not be the pressure nor interest on their part for any sort of reform amendment such as Senator Chambers is proposing. If it means an opportunity for a second public hearing, I think that that should be afforded. If it means having to put this bill back on special order to pass this year, I think that is fine but I think this is the year we should address this question. I think that that is the intent of the sunset process. Now unfortunately you may recall that really we have not done a very thorough job with any of the sunset reviews, that simply we have re-activated all the commissions that a few years ago we gloriously announced we were going to sunset but we found, in fact, those commissions do perform some necessary functions but I do think that there is a need to reform and Senator Chambers has brought this to our attention. The only issues
