SENATOR FOWLER: Okay. I misspoke I guess in the first comments I made and a legislative staff person corrected me about the sunset process. The statute indicates that this agency would terminate July 1, 1979 and I thought that meant it went out of existence. I was under the impression that some sort of bill had to be passed this year but they pointed out a section of the statute dealing with the sunset process and it is 81-199. It says, "Upon termination, each agency board or commission shall continue existence until July 1 of the next succeeding year for the purpose of concluding its affairs. During this period, such termination shall not reduce or otherwise limit the powers or authority of each respective agency. Upon the expiration of the one year after termination, each respective agency shall cease all activities." So that means that really we have got until July 1, 1980 to pass this bill and, therefore, there should be no problem in adopting Senator Chambers amendment, in having a public hearing, in holding this bill over until January 1 of next year because this board will stay in existence for another year whether or not
