LB 571, 250

SPEAKER MARVEL: Call the roll.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote found on page 1091 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Announce the vote.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 15 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is lost and the Call is raised and the bill has completed the time and so it goes to the bottom of this particular file and will be brought up again. We proceed to LB 250.

CLERK: (Read title to LB 250.) The bill was first read on January 11. It was referred to the Urban Affairs Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending by Senator George's committee.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Urban Affairs amendments, Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the committee amendments. The committee amendments have only one reason to coordinate LB 250 with LB 176. That is Senator Marsh's bill which is already on Select File or maybe already on Final. That is the only reason for the committee amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is on the adoption of the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? We are voting on the committee amendments to LB 250. Have you all voted? We are voting on the committee amendments. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator George. The committee amendments are adopted.

SENATOR GEORGE: Thank you, Mr. President. Now I move to advance LB 250 to E & R initial. As a matter of explanation, if you want to look on page 2, the main part there is that we have changed resident owners in the signed petition to owners of record title. That change simply means that anybody that owns a piece of property can vote whether he or she lives in a particular city or not. By the way, this bill last year was LB 832. It advanced unanimously out of
