search for genuine privileges and defenses that have sprung up in common law based on what can potentially be sixty years of judicial experience in other states.

SENATOR JOHNSON: And then I take it to use that defense or privilege which is the most applicable to the situation at hand in Nebraska. Would that be correct?.

SENATOR LANDIS: Yes, there is always a weighing of the factual instances in which can be applied and when the facts are the closest and an analogy can be drawn I would certainly expect a court to do exactly that.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Thank you, Senator. I want to commend you for a fine job. I think you have done a good job in bringing this bill together.

PRESIDENT: We have three minutes left. The Chair recognizes Senator Kremer. All right the question has been answered. It is time for closing if there is any closing.

SENATOR LANDIS: I will waive closing on the amendments. I want this voted on in the fifteen minutes but I do want time to add Senator DeCamp's name.

PRESIDENT: All right. So the motion is to adopt the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, I would like unanimous consent to add Senator DeCamp's name as an introducer to the bill based on his long experience in this area and his relationship with this bill.

PRESIDENT: I have been advised that Senator DeCamp has ten bills so it will be impossible to do that unless he...

SENATOR LANDIS: In that case I would like to ask for a suspension of the rules to allow his name to be added.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, due to the fact that we are up at the end of the time I would suggest that perhaps this be considered later so that we do get to the vote, not that I object here...
