LB 394, 438

SENATOR LANDIS: Fine. I move that the bill be advanced to General File.

PRESIDENT: So I will consider that you have withdrawn your motion, Senator Landis, to...

SENATOR LANDIS: I will and I move the bill be advanced to E & R initial.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance LB 394 to E & R initial. Any discussion? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The bill is advanced. LB 394 is advanced to E & R initial. Next bill will be LB 438.

CLERK: (Read title to LB 438.) The bill was read on January 17. It was referred to the Judiciary Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments by Senator Nichol's Judiciary Committee.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, this LB 438 was a Miscellaneous Subject Committee bill heard by the Judiciary Committee which allows governmental subdivisions to regulate civil rights. The committee amendments were requested by Senator...correction, by Ken Bunger from the City Attorney's office in Omaha representing Omaha. The committee amendments do two things. First, they adopt an intent section for this legislation and secondly, there are some corrections to internal references. It was felt that the intent section would be helpful in interpreting and explaining the general purpose of this legislation. I move for the adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion? The motion is to adopt the committee amendments on LB 438. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the adoption of the committee amendments on LB 438. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the committee amendments.
