SPEAKER MARVEL: Unanimous consent is requested to withdraw the amendment. Is there any objection? The Chair has two lights. Senator Wesely, for what purpose...I am sorry, Senator Pirsch, for what...do you wish to speak on the bill? The question has been called for. Shall debate cease? All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Debate has ceased. Senator Nichol, what do you wish to do with the bill?

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, move it to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is that LB 376 be advanced to E & R for review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Next bill is LB 427. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 427. Title read. The bill was first read on January 17. It was referred to the Public Health and Welfare Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments by Senator Cullan's committee.

SENATOR NICHOL PRESIDING

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the purpose of the committee amendments are to provide for general reference to national exams rather than specifically naming certain organizations. I believe that that is constitutional. Provide that investigative reports are not public records until formal charges are filed so that you do not have public some potentially damaging information about someone when no formal action is taken. Delete some repetitive sections of the bill, clarify some language. In my opinion, the committee amendments are strictly technical in nature and do not change the intent of the bill.
