I think this is one of those unique opportunities, unique opportunities where a body that is being taxed has agreed to a reform in that tax structure that I think benefits the general public. The liquor industry supports this amendment. The liquor industry supports this bill, and I think you're not going to have that happen very often, and I think that we ought to take this opportunity to raise the money that we know we're going to need for those alcoholism programs that we're going to have in this State of Nebraska. So I think we ought to seize the opportunity to raise the taxes in a more fair manner, to raise the money we're going to need, and then let's take a look at those programs. Let's do a careful analysis of whether they're accomplishing their goals, and tie it all in together, because we're going to need the money. We're going to need those programs, and maybe there's going to be a better way to administrate those programs. Maybe there's going to be a better way that we can more effectively deal with the problems that we have, and I agree with that. But let's...we're going to need the money in the first place. We're going to have to raise it in a fair manner, and this bill deals with that issue. The other issue we'll look at over the interim. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Keyes, do you wish to talk on the motion? Your light was on. Did you change your mind?

SENATOR VENDITTE: As I see our thrust in our efforts here so far this morning, I see two things that this Legislature is trying to do. Number one, we're trying to appropriate more money into a program right now that we don't know if it's working. Senator Wesely wants an interim study to see whether or not if the programs that are currently in operation in this state on alcoholism are effective. Well, ladies and gentlemen, does it take an interim study to show you...to tell you whether or not
