PRESIDENT: Clear the board, Mr. Clerk. All in favor of a Call of the House vote aye and opposed nay. Motion is the Call of the House. Record the vote.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 8 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The House is under Call. The Sergeant at Arms will bring all the members of the Legislature that are here into their desks. The House is under Call.
