SENATOR DUIS: I realize this and what I am saying is I think Senator Maresh has a point because he does have a problem coming in 250.

SENATOR KOCH: But I think, Senator Duis, Mr. Speaker, may I speak to Senator Duis?

PRESIDENT: You may answer that.

SENATOR KOCH: But doesn't 250 address the same subject matter?

SENATOR DUIS: Very similar except he is... All I am saying is Senator Maresh does have a point because he loses one chance of getting what he wants.

SENATOR KOCH: He may lose a chance but the point is, I believe for us to send 176 just like it is is, and I am saying this in good faith, Senator Duis, Senator Maresh. I am not trying to scuttle what you are trying to do. I may not support 250 but certainly I believe 176 is really a redundant piece of legislation.

SENATOR DUIS: I don't have too much more time so the thing that you are mainly interested in, Senator Koch, is the sanitary improvement district. Isn't that correct? I want Senator Maresh to know this because you are not opposing Senator Maresh here. What you are trying to do is correct the situation of the sanitary improvement district so I am wondering whether or not maybe you might be able to get an amendment together for 250 that will take care of the sanitary improvement district and at the same time take care of Senator Maresh.

SENATOR KOCH: I would be willing to work in this good faith but I may not necessarily support 250, Senator Duis.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Stoney.

SENATOR STONEY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, a question of Senator Maresh if he would respond please.

PRESIDENT: Senator Maresh, will you respond?

SENATOR MARESH: Yes, Senator Stoney.

SENATOR STONEY: Senator Maresh, in reading over the bill
