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purposes, therefore, the health of the citizens has to be subverted or made subservient to the political interest of various public officials. This is not proper. He doesn't blow smoke and fire and cook it himself. However, were I able to blow fire, I might would light some cigarettes for people but my fire might go a little further than the tip end of the cigarette. Let me point it out to you like this. Wouldn't it be rude if every time I saw you I wouldn't brush my teeth for about three days and then I would say hhhhhhhiiiiiiii and blow my breath in your face. Look at all the commercials on television telling you brush your breath with gum, brush your teeth with all types of toothpaste. One lady went out and bought all kinds of garments. The man bought all kinds of garments so that he could make it with his girl and she could make it with her guy but then a friend says, no, it is your breath. Your breath stinks. Don't blow your breath in the person's face and until you get this red toothpaste with a mouthwash in it you are not going to make it so then they brush their teeth or brush their breath and everything is all right. Well how do I feel in a restaurant when I can see your breath wafting about the place where I have to eat and it is obvious you don't care what I feel or anybody else who doesn't smoke would feel about the situation but since we are in a position to speak frankly about this issue this morning I think we ought to bring it out. The only thing I can think of that would be equivalent in rudeness and lack of consideration would be if I would cough up phlegm and spit on the floor near where a smoker is sitting. Then we could have the song, da, da, da, da, cough, cough, sniff, sniff, hmm, hmm, hmm, hmm, cough, cough, and maybe that
