doubts on the credibility of an individual who is doing business with them or anyone else. In the present bill, and I've been trying to read this to find out where it would prohibit them from carrying on that kind of business.

SENATOR LAMB: Well, as I understand it, Senator Koch, under the Committee amendments the business would have to get permission from the Public Service Commission in order to use the device.

SENATOR KOCH: Well would that be so difficult for them as long as they can show it's a bona fide nature of business and is indeed a protection to the business?

SENATOR LAMB: Well I would say there may be hundreds and hundreds of those in use in the state, and I just see no purpose in forcing every business that wants to use one of these devices to get permission from the Chamber of Commerce if they're not going to...or from the Public Service Commission if they're not going to be using them for advertising purposes, and under this amendment then those people who are going to use them for advertising purposes will still have to get permission from the Public Service Commission.

SENATOR KOCH: Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Newell, for what purpose do you rise?
