SPEAKER MARVEL: You have a motion up here to indefinitely postpone 143, and I have chosen to honor that. Now, unless you suspend the rules it can't be taken up now and the bill has to lay over till tomorrow. What's your pleasure?

SENATOR VENDITTE: Well, Mr. Chairman...Mr. Speaker, I would I guess, I have hopes perhaps maybe that the bill won't be advanced by the Legislature. I would ask unanimous consent to have that motion withdrawn.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. Is there any objection? Okay the motion before the House is the advancement of 143 to E & R for Review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. The motion is to advance the bill to E & R for Review. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 15 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill advanced. Underneath the north balcony it's my pleasure to introduce from Wisconsin Mr. and Mrs. William Gaygin. He is a Representative from Wisconsin in that State Legislature. Would you folks please stand so we may welcome you? We're happy to have you with us today. Are we ready for 484, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir, we are.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay.

CLERK: There are E & R amendments, Mr. President.

SENATOR WESELY: There we go. I move the E & R amendments to LB 484.
