SENATOR KEYES: I don't understand everything being uniform. I didn't know now that I could get taxes back on my trailer...my camper.

SENATOR MARESH: That's the way the law reads now. We're amending this, the way it says, upon the transfer of ownership of any motor vehicle...do you have this amendment before you, Senator Keyes?

SENATOR KEYES: No, I don't, I'll listen to you read it.

SENATOR MARESH: A transfer shall be credited with the number of unexpired months remaining in the registration period, that when such vehicle is transferred within the same calendar year...calendar month in which acquired, no refund shall be allowed for such month. In other words, you don't get refunded for that month if you allow...I mean if you ask for it at the beginning of the month that month doesn't count, but the months after that do. Should such transferer acquire another motor vehicle at the time of such transfer, such transferer shall have the credit herein provided applied towards payment of the motor vehicle tax then owing, then otherwise such transferer shall file a claim with the County Assessor on a form prescribed by the Auditor of Public Accounts. The County Assessor shall certify to the County Treasurer the amount of tax refund in the taxing unit where the motor vehicle is registered. The County Treasurer shall make payment to the claimant on the undisturbed motor vehicle taxes of the taxing unit where the tax money was originally distributed, but no refund of less than two dollars shall be paid. This is old language that I'm reading, and what we're doing is adding cabin trailers to the old language.

SENATOR KEYES: Okay. To me it's as clear as mud, and it's about the most important thing we file.

SENATOR MARESH: We're just adding cabin trailers to the old language that allows a refund or credit on the taxes on motor vehicles.
