PRESIDENT: Clear the board. All those in favor of a Call of the House vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 2 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The House is under Call. The Sergeant at Arms will secure the chamber, return all the legislators to the chamber and to their desks. The House is under Call. All legislators will register their presence. Senator Murphy, what do you wish to have? A roll call vote then? All right. We will wait until we get them in here. Senator Clark, are you here? Senator Kelly, I believe you are here. Senator Pirsch is here. Senator Kelly, will you record your presence? Senator Keyes. Senator Nichol is here. Senator Frank Lewis, Senator Goodrich, Senator Haberman, Senator Kennedy. Senator Lewis, Senator Haberman, Senator Kennedy and Senator Goodrich and Senator Keyes, those are the ones that are not here. Do you want the Sergeant at Arms to go over to the Governor's office and secure Senator Keyes for you? Everybody is welcome. Do you hear that answer? Okay, are you ready, Senator?

SENATOR MURPHY: If I may, Mr. President, the motion simply is to include any sales tax imposed by a city in the receipts from local funds inasmuch it is the local taxpayers who are paying it and I move that we strike this proposition so we do, in fact, bring all units of government under the same restriction.

PRESIDENT: All right, that is what is before you. Do you want to proceed with the roll call vote then at this time? Commence the roll.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote found on page 1302 of the Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. Motion to raise the Call. No objection, the Call is raised. Motion carries, the amendment is adopted. Any further amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Senator Warner now moves to amend the committee amendments. (Read Warner amendment as found on page 1303 of the Legislative Journal.)
