Senator Dworak, let me ask you a question. What was the percent of growth or not growth in Columbus High School or Columbus? Okay. Thank you, Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: I can't answer that question, Senator Simon, but if you have 27% growth like you are pointing out...

PRESIDENT: This is not orderly debate.

SENATOR SIMON: Senator Dworak doesn't know what the increased enrollment is in his district. Well I do because I try to keep up on those figures and perhaps if Senator Dworak kept up on his figures he wouldn't make such comments to this body. The point is that those that have increases in enrollment are being penalized. Those that don't have an increase in enrollment, and I would guess if I checked the figures, Senator Koch, and I am sure that you could provide them for me, I don't think there is quite the expansion in Senator Dworak's district that there is in my district, that are in other areas. It probably went down if you take a look so I can certainly understand why Senator Dworak would support this type of amendments and would oppose Senator Newell's amendment because it does not affect him and that is what the bottom line is. It is not going to hurt him a bit but it is going to hurt my district. It is going to hurt those areas that have grown. Now it is very easy to live within a lid when you have no increase in enrollment or have even a decrease as I suspect they have in Senator Dworak's area but that we're going to penalize those areas where people have chosen to live, where people have moved out and where you have very rapid expansion and what it seems to me very clearly then is that those that have the increase are the ones that are being penalized. Those that don't have to worry about it are not. I strongly rise to support the Newell amendment and I just suggest you check in your own particular districts and see exactly what the increases are. See if you would be willing to live with a 3% if you had to have a 10% or 12% increase in enrollment. I would suggest that you could not.
