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and he was a good Governor. He was one of the first ones to recommend this sort of thing and he really got shoved to one side. We have gone all of these years and I keep wondering what has been done. We organize but I need to know what has been done. It hasn't been but just a very short few years ago that my daughter wanted to go to vet's school. They didn't talk her out of it where she was going. They talked her out of it here. They recommended that she take zoology so she majored in that and physiology and chemistry. I wonder who is leading who and will this do any good to help it and, Senator Lewis, would you tell me what courses or what colleges so far have been recommended that someone drop and someone add?

SENATOR LEWIS: Well, Senator Duis, and I don't want to take a lot of your time.

SENATOR DUIS: Well you can have... I'm just curious because we have tried this all of this time and all we have gotten through is organization.

SENATOR LEWIS: I want to go back again to probably the best example I know of of a compact like this and that is the Southern Compact and they have got that down in a very sophisticated way in terms of what slots are available and where students go. The vet medicine issue is a tremendously important issue and I know your daughter happens to be one of the best horsewomen around and we have talked about that before, horseperson? Well, I still say horsewoman and I guess that is because of my upbringing, but the thing that is important is I want our students to be able to have a chance to go and I want some assured slots. As chairman of the Committee on Education for four years one of the battles we constantly fought was who is going to accept us and who is not. Who is going to cut out our slots and who is not. This kind of brings about some kind of guarantee, Senator Duis, and I think we have gone a long way. Can I continue? I don't want to take a lot of your time.

SENATOR DUIS: May I just interrupt you just one moment? I had the same problem with young men going to vet school, not from the school that is going to take them but because of the fact that they thought the tuition exchange was too high. I am interested in knowing what has been done instead of organization.

SENATOR LEWIS: I think a number of us....
