SENATOR CHAMBERS: And can, and I wish Senator DeCamp would listen with one ear, with one ear, Senator Goodrich, did Omaha recently pass a bond issue for streets?

SENATOR GOODRICH: I remember they had one up. I think it passed. I can't remember, frankly, whether it did or it didn't?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And, Senator Goodrich, are you aware of the fact that Dodge Street and certain other main thoroughfares were fixed as recently as last year and the top surface is stripping off already and they need additional repair?

SENATOR GOODRICH: I also know, Senator Chambers, for example.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would you answer that, then, on your own time? You can elaborate.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay, I don't know. I would have to review the streets to see what was repaired and what is curing off this year as to when and that sort of thing.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Members of the Legislature, Senator DeCamp is slightly off when he says that this sales tax is going to repair the streets of the chuckholes in Omaha. If that is what the city officials are telling now, then they conned the people into voting for that bond issue which was supposed to be for street repair and they do in Omaha grant annuities to certain contractors who repair the streets by allowing the same streets to fall into disrepair in the same locations year after year. So that issue should not even be raised as a justification for this sales tax. I wonder if Senator DeCamp knew and Senator Goodrich knew that when I buy a car in Lincoln I have got to pay that additional sales tax in Omaha because that is where my sales taxes are levied. So it is not just the amount that you pay on a loaf of bread, but if you buy an automobile, then thanks to Mayor Veys, the city council and the good outstate Senators, not all of them, Senator Lamb, not all of them, I had to pay more for my car than I would have had to pay otherwise and that more that I paid for did not go to the value of the car or its operation or anything tangible whatsoever. It went to help underwrite what I have referred to by harsher terms as the infrugal management of the city affairs by those who are now in office. They are incumbent and I will resist the temptation to say incompetent. I am not going to resort to the things I did last year but I am going to tell you all that
