CLERK: Senator Simon, changing from no to yes; Senator Warner voting aye; Senator Chambers voting no; Senator Hoagland voting no; Senator Pirsch voting no; Senator Marsh voting no, changing from yes to no; Senator Reutzel voting aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want the Call raised? Okay. The Call is raised. Clerk, announce the vote.

CLERK: 24 ayes and 14 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. The amendment is not adopted. While we are moving to the next amendment, from Senator Kahle's district in the South balcony, twenty-three Future Homemakers from Franklin, Nebraska, with six adults. Where are you located?

CLERK: I have an amendment offered by Senator Labeledz, Mr. President. (Read Labeledz amendment found on page 1335 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I am sure that Senator Wagner would not mind this amendment going on to his amendment. We are now making it, instead of six years, he wanted it two years and I am amending it to four years. I move for the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I think we have a procedural difficulty. If Senator Wagner's amendment was just defeated, that is my understanding, so yours would not be to amend his but an amendment to whatever is on the bill now, I think. Wouldn't that be the way we would do it? So maybe Senator Labeledz would like to alter her amendment to conform to what we have said.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Can I read my amendment then and I will sign it in a minute.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes, maam.
