

one-tenth of what I actually feel...the contempt, the loathing, the disgust. It is unspeakable. What happens in this Legislature is often obscene. Senator Stoney works for a company where a black woman right now is being made to train a white woman who came in the company later than she did so the white woman can get a job above her, and this is what often happens. My sister worked at that company, and the company made a settlement with her in a discrimination case...Mutual of Omaha, I'm talking about, and they want to pretend they don't know why we feel the way we feel. I'm for Senator Marsh's amendment. I think it is reasonable. I think it is decent. But when you look at the enforcement machinery it's not going to turn things around in this state. It's not going to give me a job, Senator Maresh, where I don't have one, so you don't have to worry about that. Senator Clark, it's not going to compel the school system to let my child sit next to a white child. You don't have to worry about that. It's not going to make them give me any job in keeping with my ability. It's not going to do away really with redlining so that I can't obtain insurance or money to rehabilitate my property. It's not going to do any of those things. So you'll still have racism intact. U.S.A.U.S.A....United States of American Union of South Africa. That's what it is, and let me tell some of you others a thing or two. There are times when a wise man will use a degree of restraint, even when the circumstances would seem to justify the other, so I'm going to exercise a little restraint and let those words suffice for now.
