LB 187, 543, 594

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried.

CLERK: Mr. President, new bill, LB 594 introduced by the Appropriations Committee and signed by the members thereof. (Read by title for the first time LB 594.)

Mr. President, Senator Warner moves to suspend Rule 3, Sections 5 and 19, and Rule 6, Section 1 so as to place LB 594 directly on General File.

SPEAKER MARVEL: This is a suspension of the rules to place the bill on General File. We're voting on placing the bill on General File. We need 30 votes. Record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 1 nay on the suspension of the rules, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The rules are suspended and the bill is placed on General File. I'd like to, before we go for the final three bills, which shouldn't take too long, I'd like to call the schedule for next Monday to your attention. We will have in the morning, we will have special order starting at about a quarter to twelve and going to 2:00 o'clock, we will have Final Reading on LB 187, which is over 300 pages. Now I understand...is Senator Keyes still in the room? Senator Keyes, are you going to attempt Monday to determine the power of 187 by moving indefinite postponement? That was your original intent. I'm trying to check on the schedule now. 187 is the 300 page bill. Okay. Are you going to make a motion...all I want to know is if you're going to make a motion.

SENATOR KEYES: I'm going to make a motion to indefinitely postpone to see if it's got enough votes to pass. If it don't have enough votes to pass, I don't want to sit through it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, then at a quarter to twelve Senator Keyes, at a quarter to twelve on Monday you can make your motion, and then if your motion loses, we will proceed to have the bill read from approximately noon to 2:00 o'clock and I would suggest that a number of the legislators consider eating their lunch in here. After 2:00 o'clock, from 2:00 to 4:00 we will have debate on appropriations. Okay, are we ready for LB 543?

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 543 was introduced by Senator Richard Marvel at the request of the Governor. (Read by title LB 543.) The bill was read on January 29 of this
