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in the elected members of OPPD and I think that if perhaps those people are not doing their job, then I think it would be up to the ratepayers to see that they get more responsible people to serve and represent them on that particular board. I think the cost impact on this particular piece of legislation would be insurmountable as time goes on and we are mandating a great deal of intricacies in this particular piece of legislation that many of us probably cannot envision at this point. We have responsible people serving us in government today. Sure there are a few of them who probably need not and should not be there. We have them here. We have them in Washington but it seems as though that minority is mushrooming and it is highly unfortunate that sometimes those public officials who are forming public opinion today are not doing what is in the best interest of the people of this state as well as in this country. There is a great deal going on within this legislative body that many of us probably are not aware of and I at times, yes, Mr. Speaker, become very frustrated and I will address that at a more appropriate time and thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I visited with Senator Kremer about this particular piece of legislation and he has no desire to send it back to committee. He thinks we ought to simply kill it here and that is what Senator Kremer's feelings were as I visited with him and perhaps he will have a motion to that effect or something. I really haven't decided whether I am going to vote to send this bill back to committee or not but I did want to make one comment and that is about the personal conflicts that are boiling over on the floor of the Legislature. I don't think that motions should be made and I don't think charges should be made about personal motives for doing things and so I simply want to urge all of you, and especially Senator Simon and others, not to make those kinds of personal charges. I don't think it does the body any good and I would simply ask you not to make those kinds of statements.

SPEAKER MARVEL: There is a motion on the Clerk's desk. The Clerk will read.
