SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: Can I have one of those copies of those amendments back? Mr. President, members of the body, I am offering an amendment which I don't clearly understand, and for that reason, I am going to ask to withdraw it for a moment so that I can better understand it. The figures that I was given and the information I have here are a little different. For that reason I need to study it for a moment. So if I could withdraw it and maybe offer it in a minute or two.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to withdraw it and offer it on Select File?

SENATOR NEWELL: Are there any other amendments on this bill?

SPEAKER MARVEL: It is going to be a little difficult to withdraw it and then bring it back in a couple of minutes because we have got thirteen bills that we are going to start working on. I think we need to work on one at a time. I am not trying to foul up your amendment.

SENATOR NEWELL: Are there any other amendments on this bill?

SPEAKER MARVEL: No. Well, let's see how this works. You ask unanimous consent to withdraw the amendments?

SENATOR NEWELL: I will do it on Select File.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. Any objections? If not, so ordered. Senator Warner, Senator Newell withdrew his amendments to LB 586 and I am going to introduce a group from Loup County High School, and then do you want to start with LB 588 next? In the North balcony from Senator Wagner's District, 15 seniors, one teacher from Loup County High School. Will you raise your hands so we can say hello to you? You are right up there, okay. Senator Warner. 588.

SENATOR WARNER: Did we vote to advance?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Oh, I am sorry. The motion is to advance LB 586 to E & R for Review. Do you have any other comments, Senator Warner? All those in favor of advancing the bill vote aye, opposed no. We are voting to advance LB 586. Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.
