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SENATOR KOCH: Senator Dworak, could you enlighten me and possibly the body as to what plans there might be for that million dollars that is presently held there?

SENATOR DWORAK: Well, Senator Dworak, I am guilty of probably that allusion and that was an allusion when we were looking at one time at a 28 million dollar reaffirmation on capital construction. We were trying to figure out maybe different ways where revenue might be increased next year and this was one of the things that we talked about but I couldn't get a firm commitment on it primarily because the committee really doesn't know for sure whether we are contractually liable or not on the darn thing and we thought that possibly over the interim we can check it out, and if we are not, come in with a bill next year to lapse it back into the general fund but I think I alluded to that million dollars and maybe a couple of others as to where we might pick up additional revenues next year but there is no way we earmarked or even tried to earmark or any way we could earmark it at this point of the game.

SENATOR KOCH: And one final question, Senator Dworak, would you be opposed to Senator George's amendment to repeal that?

SENATOR DWORAK: Yes, Senator Koch. I think we are acting before we have all the facts and that is one of the reasons the Appropriations Committee did not take the action on this specific appropriation this year, and anytime you can pick up a million dollars, you are going to do it but to pick it up and then not really having the authority to pick it up we felt we had better clarify the intent before we acted. And I still think that is prudent that that ought to be there until we know for sure we haven't obligated it contractually and we are not sure of that right now but we would be sure next year. If it is still there and still not obligated, we can put it back in. I just think it is early to act.

SENATOR NICHOL: One minute.

SENATOR KOCH: But from your information as far as you are concerned, the Papio watershed and the recreation that this money was to match as federal dollars, that that program still has some viability and there is some life in it?

SENATOR DWORAK: Senator Koch, I don't think we know the answer to that. That is what Senator Warner is saying and that is what I am saying. We don't know if it has life or does not have life at this point. Everybody seems to think
