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most satisfactory one and we are slowly building what I believe will be a very fine general practice. We have hospital privileges on both the Cambridge Memorial and the Fritzer Memorial in Oxford. The people in Oxford are very pleased with the circumstances that has permitted them to have a patient census with the visibility of a first rate community hospital. Both Virginia and our sons, Trent and Todd, and I want you to visit with us if you have the opportunity in the near future." Dr. Horton drove all the way in from Arapahoe to tell me how pleased he was to get back to Nebraska and take his two boys out pheasant hunting. Dr. Krietler in Tilden has stated the same thing. We had six doctors come in here in the last two weeks from outstate to go and look at smaller communities to practice medicine and their reasoning is that we have something here that many states do not have, and when we start tightening up the projects as we have today, let's say anyone can quote figures but I tell you very sincerely and truly with my Irish humor the only figures that I really can say that you can look at and believe, if you are in Hawaii you look at those figures, and as Senator Landis smiles, they are beautiful figures and you can believe them.

SPEAKER MARVEL: One minute.

SENATOR KENNEDY: Thank you. And I would say again these figures can be quoted, what did it cost for the house that you built five years ago, what did it cost for a nursing home five years ago, what was my farm land worth? It has increased not only 300% but more than that. We have got inflation to consider and all of these things to consider. I think we have made a tragic mistake here today without any consideration of each individual amendment should have probably been considered. They are needed, two changes in the bill that the committee put out, and if you look at the way the bill came out of committee, see how strong it came out of committee after all of that discussion. See how the serious people that have worked not once, two, three, four times but maybe two or three or four years. I appreciate you listening. I am glad we had a Call of the House. I really think we ought to reconsider what we've done. I think we've made a tragic mistake. I would love to argue the point further.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Duis. Your light was on before.
