SENATOR NEWELL: I'm glad there's no further amendments being offered to this bill. We have a problem. We had a compromise which was supposed to come through and there has been some changes in it. I would not like to see any other changes so I'm glad that there has been a last-minute saving me and the bill and the Committee amendments by the Attorney General's office, and hopefully we can get back to that sort of an agreement. For that reason I move the advancement. Senator DeCamp is correct. There are some definite...excuse me, adoption of the committee amendments.
