They had a policewoman acting under cover, walking on the street, or standing on the street, like any woman might do and she was propositioned by twenty-six people, men ranging in ages from eighteen to sixty and two of them, when they found out what was happening, jumped in their cars and tried to get away and they got citations, Senator Venditte, for driving under the influence. Now perhaps the way to really fight prostitution, if it's considered an evil, is to put the pressure on the buyers. Put the pressure on the buyer, because until an actual agreement and contract is entered into and an act occurs there is not prostitution, it might be solicitation or whatever else you want to call it. Now if every man who went on the street for these illicit evil purposes, Senator Venditte, was under the impression or had lurking in the back of his mind that this might be an undercover policewoman, then maybe no woman would be approached on the street as though she is a prostitute, and as I said to an individual when I heard the good news on the radio this morning that they're catching men, all that a man will say to a woman on the street, if anything, is, good morning ma'm or good evening ma'm, or whatever the time of day or night it might be, but not your place or mine. As long as you zero in on the unfortunate people who are really the victims of prostitution, which will be the women, there will be no handling of this situation. A lot of times if you see movies, or the pulp magazines, the prostitute is portrayed as an attractive urbane, living high off the hog female who could be the escort or consort of a member of Parliament, which in England apparently happens because they wanted a bill passed relating to loosening up the restrictions on prostitution, and they filled the balconies and when the men got ready to vote, they made these men know they were there and said if you vote wrong we'll tell on you, and the bill that would liberalize the prostitution laws was passed. But nevertheless the point I'm trying to get to, many of the women who are prostitutes are young...
