SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is to advance the bill. All those in favor say aye, opposed say no. The motion...you want a machine vote? Okay. All those in favor of advancing the bill vote aye, those opposed vote no. Motion is on the advancement of the bill. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 9 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion carried, the bill is advanced. Senator George, are you going to take LB 181?

CLERK: Mr. President, there are E & R amendments to LB 181.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: I move the E & R amendments to LB 181.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. The motion carried. The amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have an amendment offered by Senator George on page 1261 but I understand that he wishes to withdraw that.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, I would like to have unanimous approval to withdraw that amendment. The amendment had to be redrawn to be somewhat more specific at the request of the City of Omaha. Therefore, the first amendment that I offered is superfluous. I ask to have it removed.

SPEAKER MARVEL: No objections? So ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator George now moves to amend and those amendments are on page 1417 of the Journal.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, I ask for the adoption of that amendment. The third provision how to pay for the construction of parking facilities and this is a bill for the City of Omaha, metropolitan class city, was originally states in the bill, by any other means. That of course means kind of a blank check and I don't think, and I think that you agree that the legislation should not be passed that way. The amendment now makes it more specific in what means the construction of parking garages could be financed. Could the Clerk just please read the amendment?

CLERK: Read the George amendment.
