

the council, the mechanism within the Department of Environmental Control that handles the awarding of grants, funds, so on and so forth makes decisions where programs go. Section 6, the fund itself is defined. Section 7, the Director, obviously the Director of Environmental Control. Litter comprehensively defined, manufacturer defined. Section 10, person defined, same statutory definition that we already have. Public place defined. Section 11, why public place? Because we have envolved there certain duties upon people that are holding places open to the public. Recycling defined, Section 12, Section 13 recycling center defined. 14, resource recovery defined. 15, source separation defined. Section 15, rule and regulation authorities you know you need in most major legislation. Section 17 authorizes the council to designate litter prone activities in areas and require minimum standards for litter receptacles. 18 requires the owner of an establishment or public place then, which we defined before, to have a litter container under penalty of law, so that if you have a drive in you have got to have a litter container there so they just don't throw it out on the ground. 18, 19 relating to the litter containers. 20, in order to find out more about litter we designate and direct and order the department to complete a litter survey. This is something that Mr. Drain was insisting on for his use in getting federal funds and knowing where to put the emphasis on recycling and these kind of things. Section 21, the key thing that gives us the authority to work with, use the federal funds and set up programs such as using Boy Scouts, Churches or whatever to get grants to go out and clean litter and set up recycling programs in different communities. Section 22, directions to the department such as setting up road side signs that say don't litter here or penalty for littering, such and such a penalty \$200 or whatever it is. Section 23, delegates the director the necessary tools for enforcement of the provisions of the act. I might mention that we involve all law enforcement, Game Wardens you name it in enforcing this law. Section 24, again we are going to get road side signs up where everybody becomes litter conscious it directs the director to get these signs up. It shows the penalties. You have seen a lot of this in the eastern states. Okay then Section 25, the litter reduction and recycling fund. 26, the mechanism of the tax that we discussed a \$150 per million dollars gross sale, a two tiered tax. Section 27, this section sets out ten classifications upon which the class is imposed with Senator Maresh's amendment I guess we would be twelve then with wine and liquor.
