CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Newell now has a second amendment. It is again a three page amendment.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, I explained them both at the same time. One was a rewrite of some language that was in there to make it meld, that is the first one, and the second one is the one that deals with the officers.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is the adoption of the second Newell amendment to LB 224. Will you clear the Board please. All those in favor of the second Newell amendment to LB 224 vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the resolution.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the second Newell amendment is adopted. Senator Wesely, LB 224.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, Mr. Speaker, I move that LB 224 be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. The bill is advanced. We go now to LB 559, Senator Wesely.
