SENATOR CARSTEN: I believe, Senator Murphy, that there is adequate and proper statutes that provide for that now. That's my understanding. It was in regard to those that I believe the Attorney General based his opinion that we needed to clarify that portion in this part of LB 285.

SENATOR MURPHY: I was concerned that if the notice...if the prior notice of a special election is too long it's going to make it very nearly impossible for a school board to determine that they need that election but that's fine, I just wanted to pose the question. Thank you.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, could I comment just further on that very question?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes, sir.

SENATOR CARSTEN: There is provided in the section here fifteen days' notice. It is provided in the section even here, Senator Murphy.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Frank Lewis and then Senator Warner. Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: Mr. President, I would like to ask Senator Carsten a couple of questions. Senator Carsten, does this alter in any way the percentage level that's imposed on local subdivisions?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Alter? No. No.

SENATOR LEWIS: The percentage level would remain the same. It does not change anything in terms of increasing or decreasing percentages to the school districts?

SENATOR CARSTEN: That's correct.

SENATOR LEWIS: These are technical amendments that you need in order to facilitate the bill if it were to pass?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Yes, and in compliance with the comments from the Attorney General.

SENATOR LEWIS: Okay. Fine.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner, did you have your light on?

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I think Senator Lewis asked
