CLERK: That's correct.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is the reconsideration of the first Koch amendment that was offered. Is there any other discussion? Senator Keyes, your light's on. Do you want to discuss the reconsideration motion?

SENATOR KEYES: Is that the amendment that's been accepted or those that haven't been accepted?

SPEAKER MARVEL: No, we're working on the first Koch amendment, the reconsideration.

SENATOR KEYES: Reconsideration...that one was not accepted. Now I have an amendment up there that's going to strike the bill and bring it back to its original form as it was introduced, strike all the amendments, so I wanted to know that.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. Now the motion now is on the reconsideration of the first Koch amendment. All those in favor vote aye. Opposed no. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 6 nays on the motion to reconsider, Mr. President.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Now, Mr. President, I move the Koch amendment that failed be passed.

SPEAKER MARVEL: What was the motion?

CLERK: The motion is to adopt the Koch amendment, Mr. President.
