CLERK: 9 ayes, 15 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Next motion is on LB 42. Mr. Clerk. The Speaker suggest that since Senator DeCamp is considering some kind of Attorney General's opinion on this bill that we pass it over for the time on LB 42. So there is a resolution, Mr. Clerk. What is it? LR 66? Resolution on the desk. Read the resolution, Mr. Clerk, LR 66.

CLERK: (Read LR 66.) Mr. President, that resolution is on page 1671 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President and members, without doing an excessive amount of bragging I would like to remind this body that not only is Miss Nebraska, U.S.A. from my district but the current Miss Nebraska in the Miss America pageant that I think was in the top ten or the top five last year was also from my district and I think we... Personally I am a little bit proud of that that we have got some pretty nice looking gals out in our part of the country. This particular girl here is representing the State of Nebraska very well I might add, in the Miss U.S.A. pageant that will be...the finals will be taking place this next Monday and it seems to me that we, the members of this body, should certainly congratulate her and wish her luck in her efforts to represent this great state. I would urge the adoption of this resolution.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion on the Vickers' resolution #66? I guess, Senator Vickers, that constitutes your opening and your closing and the motion before the House is the adoption of the resolution, LR 66. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? We are voting on the Vickers' resolution LR 66. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The resolution carries. LR 66 is adopted. The
