in them, to be used. However, in deference and fairness to them, I wish to withdraw my amendments and allow them to attempt their bill without the amendments. If it fails to advance, then I would offer the amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The request from Senator DeCamp is to withdraw his amendments. Hearing no objections, so ordered. What is the next amendment?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is offered by Senator Simon and that amendment is on page 1573 and 1574 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Simon.

SENATOR SIMON: There are two amendments and we will just take them as they are printed in the Journal. The first amendment is found on page 1573. I understand both of these amendments have been accepted by Senator Labeledz, Venditte and Kahle, they have no problem with it. Let me...I don't want to make any bones about it. I don't like the bill. I may still vote against it very likely but I am going to try and make a bad bill better, if that is possible.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, your motion to start with is the adoption of your amendment #1 which is on page 1573.

SENATOR SIMON: Right. Essentially what that amendment says is that the Legislature does not necessarily support the use of laetrile. I don't want anybody to get the understanding that this Legislature does support that. It states, "Nothing in this act shall be constructed as constituting an endorsement of laetrile for the treatment of malignancy, disease, illness, physical condition and nothing in this act shall require a licensed physician to prescribe or administer laetrile to a patient under his or her care." I move for adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wesely, do you wish to be heard on the Simon amendment? Senator Kahle, do you wish to be heard on the Simon amendment, or if one of the three coinroducers wishes to speak on this, if he will let me know I will recognize them. Do you wish to speak on it, Senator Kahle?

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Speaker, I believe that Senator Labeledz has the amendments that would cover what Senator Simon is trying to do and perhaps we could save time if she would speak and tell what she is trying to do with those amendments.
