SPEAKER MARVEL: Any other discussion on the amendment? Senator Simon, do you wish to close? Waive closing. Senator Kahle.

SENATOR KAHLE: I, too, support Senator Simon's approach to this, and as far as Senator Stoney was concerned, I would think that the same procedure should be followed that is followed for the consent to have an operation and that would be the simplest way to handle it. I will find out what that is and see that it is put in there. I think this should take away the qualms that many of you have about this bill. After the doctor has discussed it with the patient, the patient signs the form, it certainly would indicate that that patient knows then what the chances are, what the material is that is going to be used and that then the doctor could administer it without any fear of being in trouble with the federal food and drug people and those others that might be involved. So I support this. I think this should make it palatable to everybody.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is the adoption of the Simon amendment #2 as found on page 1574. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? We are voting on the Simon amendment #2 to LB 382. It is found on page 1574 of the Journal. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to adopt, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried and the Simon amendment #2 is adopted. Next amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendments are offered by Senator Labeledz, Venditte and Kahle and those amendments are on page 1700 of the Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I recognize Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Mr. Speaker, the amendments I think was passed out this morning and I would like to go over them section by section. It is a complete rewrite of the bill. Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 are identical to the original bill. Section 5, the initial language is the same as that in section 5 of the original bill. This section prescribes the precise form of the required statement of informed consent.
