SENATOR CLARK: What you are really saying is that they cannot...they would not have to do it, you know, and that is all it says. They would not...not be refused from doing it if a physician prescribed it.

SENATOR JOHNSON: I am confident, Senator Clark, that in probably ninety-five or ninety-nine percent of the cases, the hospital, the nursing home, the health care facility would administer the drug because their doctor has prescribed it but there could well be a case where they are as troubled about the situation as am I and I am putting in a conscience clause. Now you know the abortion statute says this. No hospital, clinic, institution or other facility in this state shall be required to admit any patients for the purpose of performing an abortion nor require to allow the performance of an abortion therein. I mean that is a bona fide conscience clause that has been built into the abortion law.

SENATOR CLARK: I guess what my question is, is why do we question the physician? If you are going to regulate the physician, I think you are in real trouble if you try to regulate them because you are already setting them up as gods. They are the ones that say this, and as long as you are going to hold them up in that high aspire why are you trying to regulate them. The physician is the one that is doing it and all they are saying is when the physician says give them the drug they are going to get the drug and the other third party cannot say no. Now that to me is all it says, is that right?

SENATOR JOHNSON: Yes, I think you are right, and I think that is exactly what it says is the third party can't say no if the physician says simply give (interruption).

SENATOR CLARK: And you disagree with that?

SENATOR JOHNSON: In this particular case, I do disagree with that (interruption).

SENATOR CLARK: Why?

SENATOR JOHNSON: Because of the kind of anguish that I personally am having over laetrile and I am a third party too, mind you.

SENATOR CLARK: You shouldn't have any anguish over laetrile. You are not going to take it. If you don't want it, you don't have to take it. There is no physician that has to
