

and to some people this is a new effort but I submit that people in the livestock industry have been a part of this for many years. Veterinarians have been trained to inspect food that people eat in this country for a long time. This has been done through the products of meat, milk, poultry, eggs and so forth and these inspectors have been trained by veterinarians for the most part and will continue to work along these same lines and I submit that consumers generally have as much stake in this veterinarian college as the livestock industry people do. I would like to bring to your attention the answer to the question why was Lincoln, Nebraska selected by these other states and I think it speaks well for our University of Nebraska because in effect they said that Nebraska was very capable of teaching the basic sciences that are a part of the veterinarian courses. Somebody quoted this veterinarian and that veterinarian said we didn't need it and yet I asked the question, who speaks for the veterinarians. I have had veterinarians speak to me who definitely want this. They are working hard for it themselves and I doubt if there is any one veterinarian who speaks for the rest of them. I would like to grant a little of my time to Senator Schmit who has some other remarks he would like to make. I urge support of the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, I believe Senator Rumery indicated that he would like to yield the rest of his time to Senator Schmit. Mr. Speaker, I believe Senator Rumery indicated he wanted to reserve the rest of his time for Senator Schmit, if he had time remaining. Did he have time remaining?

I represent Lincoln, of course, and from my point of view, this should be considered pure pork barrel and I suppose I should be in favor of it but I really believe that if you want to keep your hands on the purse strings you can't keep them there some times and stick them in the pork barrel at other times, and I am calling upon the Lincoln Senators and upon the rural Senators to be fiscally respon-
