SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Koch, do you want to speak to the Murphy amendment?

SENATOR KOCH: I am trying to find where he is amending.

Yes, I am perfectly amenable. I have no desire to see the city get wealthy but by the same token I don't like to see (interruption).

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, in the essence of time, I will accept the Murphy amendment for the present and I will relook at it and Select File to see what has happened.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is the adoption of the Murphy amendment to the committee amendments. All those in favor of the Murphy amendment vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion carried and the amendment is adopted. Any other amendments to the committee amendments?

CLERK: No, sir, I have no further amendments to the committee amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, then the motion is the adoption of the committee amendments as amended. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. Record.
