SENATOR KELLY: Mr. Speaker, I would like to request a roll call vote. Are all of the people here from the Call? We are, I think, three or four short.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Keyes is here but he needs to record his presence. Senator Goodrich and Senator Clark are the only two unaccounted for. Senator Kelly, do you want to proceed with the vote? Call the roll.

CLERK: Roll call vote taken. (See pages 1763 and 1764, Legislative Journal.) 22 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. Next amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Johnson has amendments but I understand he wishes to withdraw those.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Johnson asks unanimous consent to withdraw his amendments. Hearing no objection, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have an amendment offered by Senator Murphy. The amendment reads as follows: To strike subsection 12, (e) in section 1 of the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: Ladies and gentlemen, let me background you just a little bit to what happened last year when 469, the forerunner of this operation, happened. I went to the committee and I went to the proponents of this bill, and at my suggestion they went to the Attorney General relative to the wording in the amendment and the lack of clarity.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Call is raised.

SENATOR MURPHY: We had a great deal of time in which to bring that back and reconstruct the wording so that it was meaningful. I asked that the word "redevelopment" be clarified. I asked that the conflict between paid in full and fifteen years be eliminated. They elected not to do it, just flatly made the determination they were going to run it the way it was even though the Attorney General in his letter said he found it confusing. Well, we have another piece of confusion here that again the people of this state did not vote on. My amendment strikes the proposition that under the redevelopment act, the incremental tax base, that someone can go in and establish a Heritage House,
