Legislature should be told one thing and then have something else done. I do wholeheartedly support the amendments.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, in case some of you were not listening when Senator Warner explained, this is not a continuation of the areas of excellence which were funded a number of years ago. Senator Newell, I tried to explain this one other time to you that it's good business procedure to review those things which you are doing in a business way, and the business of the University is teaching research as well as public service. It's important that the University continue to review all aspects, not just the areas of excellence which were originally funded, but on a five year rotating basis each of the departments, within a five year period of time you need to have an outside expert look at you, not just you looking at what you have done as the department heads, Senator Newell, that there are advantages to having other experts in the field share their expertise with you to help keep the quality, or to upgrade the quality, and in some cases to say, there are not sufficient students so this is one area which could be reduced, and there are examples of that. This is not the continuation, Senator Newell, of the areas of excellence, and I hope that the legislative body is listening to this explanation. This is not an amendment we need. It is one that should be voted down. It was presented under false colors. It is not what Senator Newell said it was. I urge you to oppose this amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, I call for the question.

SENATOR CLARK: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? I do. The question is, shall debate now cease? Those voting aye, or nay. The question is ceasing debate.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The debate is ceased. Senator Newell, do you wish to close?

SENATOR NEWELL: I do. Mr. President and members of the body, it is most interesting that Senator Warner and Senator
