your job you also sacrifice your unemployment benefits, because you're a married person and because you're staying together. That's grounds for divorce in this state, and yet at the same time we're turning around and saying, unless you separate we'll deny you benefits. I think that's unfair. I hope that would strike the conscience of this Legislature that it's unfair as it has the majority of states in the Union. If that's the case, I hope you will pass the Landis-Brennan amendments. I think they add a measure of equity. They certainly meet the objections of the lack of descriptiveness. We have a legislative history now that says, better employment means shorter hours or better wages. If we want to we can put that in an amendment. There is no need for greater description, although I am willing and able to do that on Select File if that's the wish of the body. There is no problem with the fact that this will be interpretable because we have a mechanism for interpretation. That is the Nebraska Appeals Tribunals. What we have here is a reluctance to broaden our unemployment compensation law to cover some unequitable situations, and I'm hoping the body today will look at this amendment and see fit to pass it. Thank you.
